NOTES ON THE PREACHING SERIES

- The 'Focus' column on the table has the part of the Bible that captures the focus or theme for that Sunday. The reading that comes from that part of the Bible would therefore be the passage preached on. For example, in week 12, the reading to preach on would be Matthew 13:1-9. Occasionally the preaching will cover more material/themes than can be read. For example, in week 1, because the focus is Genesis chapters 1-3, the preaching will not be limited to the reading on Genesis 1:1-19 but traverse the Creation and Fall themes in Genesis 1/2 and 3 respectively.
- The reading that captures the focus/theme for each week is taken from one of the five personal readings in each week of the E100 Challenge. I have prayerfully selected the other two readings for each week to go with the focus passage.
- If desired, the preaching series could be punctuated with a short break in between the Old and New Testament sections and this might be determined by the time in the year your centre ran the series. For instance, if you decided to run it from term 1, 2012, it would be interrupted by Palm Sunday/Easter. I would advise against too long a break in order to avoid losing focus and momentum. The other consideration of course is that it is meant to correspond with and keep up with the personal reading challenge being undertaken by your people.

Costs

Scripture Union (SU) has a 10-pack deal on the website. The pack contains:

- 10 punch out personal reading guides
- 10 companion books
- 1 small group discussion guide

Price: \$175.

To save a further 10% on the 10-pack deal, <u>if we made one bulk order at once</u> for all our resource needs, each 10-pack is \$157.50.

SU tells me that it would be possible for a home group just to have one Discussion Guide rather than everyone having to buy a discussion guide on top of their personal reading guide and companion book.

Options

Of course you might decide for your centre to have the E100 personal Bible reading challenge without also the accompanying preaching series and with or without doing the home group studies. In my view the ideal would be all three components in order to get depth as well as breadth and reinforcement of the themes through repetition each week (in personal reading, home group and church).

Promotion & preparation

If you decide to do the E100 Challenge in your centre, I strongly recommend that you give careful thought to a lead-up time that will creatively promote it and build anticipation and excitement. After all, it is a challenge, and it is an epic journey, beginning at Creation and ending at the New Creation. I would be more than happy to offer suggestions on ways to do this, including showing the brief E100 Challenge promo video in church.

If you had home groups that didn't want to be locked into 20 weeks of studies, I can recommend a Bible study resource that covers the main movements of the Old Testament in eight studies. At least they would have seen the big picture of the OT.
