### Introduction

Please stand. Led by the Dean.

Let us observe one minute's silence to acknowledge all those in the Tasmanian community who have been subjected to the terrible harm of family violence. This includes the women and men, boys and girls who have died as the result of family violence or have been, or are still, suffering as a result of physical violence or emotional or financial abuse from a member of their family. We also remember members of their families who have to bear the knowledge of their loved ones' experiences.

#### A candle is lit.

In this service, as well as grieving with and for those who are victims we need to recognize where the Church has failed to respond appropriately to victims of domestic abuse in all its various forms. We must commit ourselves to pastoral practices which prioritises the safety and care of victims, challenges all abusive behaviours especially those occurring in our midst, and works for the healing of all: women, children and men.

Let us hear from the Scriptures the cry of one abused by a companion.

# Psalm 55:1-8, 12-14, 20-21

- <sup>1</sup>Give ear to my prayer, O God; do not hide yourself from my supplication. <sup>2</sup>Attend to me, and answer me; I am troubled in my complaint.
- I am distraught <sup>3</sup> by the noise of the enemy, because of the clamour of the wicked.

For they bring trouble upon me, and in anger they cherish enmity against me.

Address The Bishop

The Bishop's address ends with the following apology.

To those who have been harmed by violence and abusive behaviours, we say sorry for any ways we have made your journey even harder.

We are sorry for those times when church leaders were slow to listen or slow to believe or understand your story.

We are sorry for those times we did not recognize how cruel and controlling a range of abusive behaviours can be.

We are sorry if you were not told emphatically or often enough that the violence is never your fault, and that abuse is not love.

We are sorry when our attempts to help have left you and your children exposed to more risk.

We are sorry for those times when our theology has lacked the wisdom of wise pastoral practice.

We are sorry when we have made you feel weighed down with a sense of failure and feeling responsible to make things right.

We are sorry for those times we thought we knew best, but you really needed to make your own decisions in your own time.

### 1 John 1:5-10

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. <sup>6</sup>If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; <sup>7</sup>but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. <sup>8</sup>If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. <sup>9</sup>If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. <sup>10</sup>If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

For those who have harmed others by their actions or their inaction, Lord, hear our prayer.

For all who live with painful memories,

Lord, hear our prayer.

For all who are searching for healing and hope,

Lord, hear our prayer.

For wisdom in working for a future of justice and integrity,

Lord, hear our prayer.

For honesty and accountability in all our relationships,

Lord, hear our prayer.

For grace to change and be changed as you forgive us,

Lord, hear our prayer.

And now as our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are confident to pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,

your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us.

Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.
